OUR MISSION

Educational

To provide education to underprivileged children throughout the remote villages and towns of Haiti.



Medical

To provide medical care to communities without clinics, hospitals, doctors, or nurses.



Spiritual

To provide places and activities that foster community growth and spiritual vitality.





E D U C A T I O N A L

What we have done:

- Opened an elementary school in 2000
- Opened a secondary school in 2006 and added one grade per year
- Conducted yearly teacher workshops for our teachers and the surrounding school teachers
- Improved every year on the passing rate for primary school students to secondary school students (92 percent passing rate achieved for the class of 2009)
- Provided education to more than 3,000 primary and secondary students
- Inaugurated an interscholastic sports and academics league (LIJAS) in 2009
- Sponsored three recent university graduates in the areas of nursing, computer science and science education

What we will do:

- Collaborate with other schools in the area to improve their performance at the state board exam
- Adopt other schools
- Build primary and/or secondary schools when and where necessary
- Continue to conduct educational workshops for the schools in the area
- Continue to expect greater than 90 percent passing rate at our schools and our partnering schools
- Establish a trade school in the areas of mechanics, masonry, computer science and tailoring
- Work with the education arm of the government to help improve the teaching methods in Haiti's schools
- Establish a training center for teachers

- ◆ Of Haiti's 8.7 million inhabitants, approximately half are illiterate.
- ◆ In Haiti, the enrollment rate for primary school is 67 percent. At the secondary level, the figure drops to 15 percent.
- ◆ Ninety percent of education in Haiti is private.





M E D I C A L

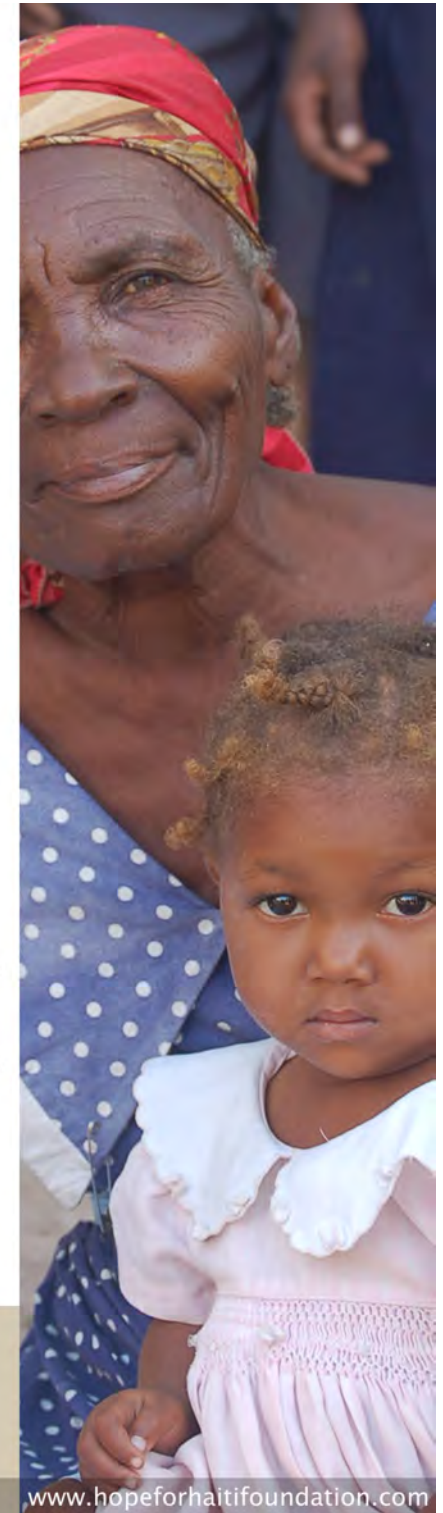
What we have done:

- Conducted a mobile medical clinic in 2000 and every year since
- Opened a full-time primary care clinic with laboratory and pharmacy, staffed by Haitian medical professionals
- Conducted the very first community health assessment of Bainet and its districts in 2008
- Purchased two buildings in Bainet that will be retrofitted into a dormitory
- Established community health workers throughout the districts of Bainet
- Virtually eradicated parasites from the community with worm treatments
- Due to the year-round screening and care from the Haitian-run clinic, HFHF held the first “appointment only” specialty clinic in January 2009 with doctors in the cardiology, pediatrics, gastrointestinal, midwifery, and optometry fields.
- Identified two new districts in Haiti (Gandou and Gris Gris) for future clinics

What we will do:

- Continue to operate the medical clinic in Zorangé
- Establish and train traditional birth attendants to serve the area throughout Bainet
- Hire doctors, midwives and additional community health workers
- Build two new clinics in Gandou and Gris-Gris, Bainet
- Open a medical clinic in Cape Rouge, Jacmel
- Partner with the Haitian Ministry of Health to provide emergency medical care in Bainet
- Partner with established clinics throughout Bainet to improve medical care in rural communities
- Establish a medical emergency response system to coordinate medical services in Bainet
- Conduct medical training for the staff to continue their education and improve medical services

- ▲ Forty percent of the Haitian population does not have access to primary health care.
- ▲ Haiti has the worst malnutrition, the highest rates of infant and maternal mortality, and the worst AIDS epidemic in the Americas.
- ▲ Many children die before age 5; those that survive past age 5 have a life expectancy of only 43 years.





S P I R I T U A L

What we have done:

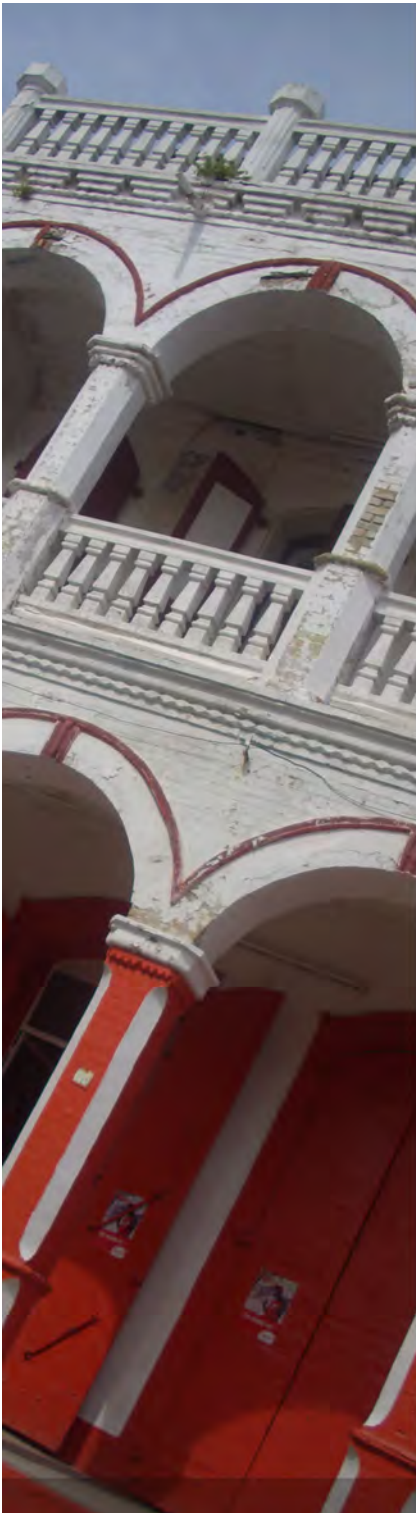
- Collaborated with church leaders in the area
- Conducted a Bible conference to equip 12 church leaders in 2008
- Planted a new church in 2008
- Held multiple revivals for the community
- Established a weekly children and youth ministry for the community
- Started a weekly adult Bible study at the Zorangé school
- Broadcasted revivals and church sermons through Radyo Bigot

What we will do:

- Continue to conduct Bible conferences for church leaders in the community
- Expand into other communities in Bainet to plant churches where necessary
- Establish a Bible training center in Bainet
- Collaborate with and/or adopt other churches in the area
- Form a children's choir that will travel and compete
- Train a worship band for the benefit of Zorangé and the surrounding communities

- ◆ About 95 percent of the Haitian population claim Christian beliefs.
- ◆ Haiti was colonized during a period in which Roman Catholicism was prevalent among European monarchs, and Catholicism still accounts for about 80 percent of religion in Haiti.
- ◆ Many Haitians still practice elements of the traditional Vodou (Voodoo), often alongside their Christian faith.
